## **Group Study Questions**

### **Opening Question:**

• What's the most unexpected journey or detour you've experienced in life? How did you handle it?

#### **General Observation:**

- What stood out to you most from the sermon about Mary and Joseph's unexpected journey?
- How does the pastor compare our modern Christmas preparations to Mary and Joseph's situation?

#### **Understanding the Message:**

- The pastor says, "Expect the unexpected." How does this relate to the Christmas story?
- What does the sermon suggest about God's timing versus our own plans?
- How does the pastor explain the idea that "chaos, not comfort, builds character"?

#### **Personal Application:**

- When have you found yourself on a journey you didn't choose? How did you respond?
- The sermon mentions doing "what you know to do when you don't know what to do." What does this look like in your life?
- How do you typically respond to unexpected changes or challenges? Do you tend to react with faith or fear?
- In what areas of your life might God be calling you out of your comfort zone to build character?

## **Action Steps:**

- This week, identify one area where you need to trust God's timing. What practical step can you take to demonstrate faith in that situation?
- The sermon challenges us to examine where we're demonstrating faith. Choose one area this week where you can step out in faith instead of succumbing to fear.
- Practice finding joy in a difficult circumstance this week. How can you intentionally shift your perspective?
