Waiting on God Group Study Questions

Opening Question:

• Share a time when you had to wait for something important. How did you feel during the waiting period, and what was the outcome?

General Observation:

- What stood out to you most from the sermon about waiting on God?
- How does Pastor Kris describe the purpose of waiting in our spiritual lives?

Understanding the Message:

- In the sermon, Pastor Kris talks about Simeon waiting to see the Messiah. What promises did Simeon hold onto during his wait?
- How does the pastor connect the idea of waiting with developing patience as a fruit of the Spirit?
- What Bible verses does Pastor Kris use to support the idea that God's promises sustain us during waiting periods?

Personal Application:

- Pastor Kris says, "Wait through until your breakthrough." How does this phrase challenge or encourage you in your current season of life?
- The sermon mentions that God often uses waiting periods to change us. Can you think of a time when God used a period of waiting to transform an area of your life or character?
- How do you typically respond when God doesn't answer your prayers or fulfill His promises as quickly as you'd like?

Action Steps:

- Pastor Kris encourages serving others while we wait. What is one way you can serve someone else this week, even as you're in your own "waiting room"?
- How can you intentionally engage in worship and community during times of waiting, rather than isolating yourself?
